A little over a thousand years ago a Persian poet named Ferdowsi of Tous collected and put into heroic verse the millennium old mythological and epic traditions of Iran.

It took him thirty years to write the sixty thousand verses that comprise the Shahnameh (The Book of Kings). This monumental tome is one of the most important literary works of Iran and like other great epics, such as Gilgamesh, The Odyssey, Nibelungenlied and Ramayana, it is a record of the human imaginative consciousness. It is well known and has been adapted throughout the Near East, Central Asia and India but is mostly unknown in the West. Feathers Of Fire is one of the love stories in the Shahnameh.

There is a great power in live performance. Feathers Of Fire: A Persian Epic exposes children and adults to a broader view of this world. It introduces new characters

and places, teaches them about the history of civilization and reinforces the positive attributes of what it means embrace all of one's humanity. It is our intention to highlight the strength of the culture and promote a more complex and interesting view of Iran here in the United States.

Our goal is to present a more holistic view of Iran to wider audiences by presenting stories and aspects of Shahnameh in different media, which we are collectively calling "The Shahnameh Project."

The first of this project, Shahnameh: The Epic of the Persian Kings, a 600page illustrated new translation and adaptation and published in 2013, is now in its 2nd edition. We have created an elaborate pop-up book due out in 2018. We have also created a short shadow puppet show, based on the story of Zahhak, as well as an audiobook version of our Shahnameh book. Feathers Of Fire: A Persian Epic, the shadow play, is the fifth part of "The Shahnameh Project."



HAMID RAHMANIAN

(Creator, Designer & Director,) a 2014 Guggenheim Fellow, is an award winning visual artist/ filmmaker born and educated in Tehran, Iran. His work centers on film and graphic arts. His

narrative and documentary films have premiered at Venice, Sundance, Toronto, Tribeca and IDFA Film Festivals. He has won numerous international awards and his works have been televised on international networks including PBS, Sundance Channel, IFC, Channel 4, BBC, and Al Jazeera. Rahmanian undertook the immense task of illustrating and commissioning a new translation and adaptation of Shahnameh by Ferdowsi, entitled, Shahnameh: The Epic of the Persian Kings (2013, Quantuck Lane Press), which is now in its second edition and available as an audiobook. Rahmanian has created a pop-up book based on his Shahnameh, which is due out in 2018.



LARRY REED (Shadow Master) is an internationally recognized theater director and is one of the few American dalangs ("shadow masters") of traditional Balinese shadow theater known as Wayang Kulit.

The founder and artistic director of ShadowLight Productions, Reed has pioneered contemporary shadow theater by integrating traditional shadow theater techniques with film, modern theater, and dance styles. A true multidisciplinary artist, Reed has also written, directed, and produced films in the US and Mexico. Shadow Master (1979) has been shown on the PBS and the Discovery Channel. Reed has garnered numerous awards and honors, and was named one of Top 50 Artists in the SF Bay Area by Metropolitan Magazine in 1995 and 1996.



LOGA RAMIN TORKIAN

(Composer) is an Iranian-born multi-instrumentalist and composer. He is recognized internationally for his groundbreaking work with World Music groups Niyaz and Axiom Of

Choice, both of which he co-founded. A highly-gifted composer and a visionary, Loga is greatly respected for his ability to adapt the Persian classical repertoire to his own unique and modern compositions. In 2014 Loga was nominated for a Canadian JUNO Award in the Category of "Best World Music Album" for the album he recorded with musical partner Azam Ali titled, "Lamentation of Swans." He continues to produce albums and tour worldwide with NIYAZ.



AZAM ALI (Composer) is one of the most prolific, versatile, and gifted singers/ composers on the international music stage today. Azam's most notable work is with the cutting-edge world music electro-acoustic

project NIYAZ. Her distinctive voice can be heard on myriad film and television scores including "Thor-The Dark World", "Matrix- Revolutions", "Prince of Persia- The Sands of Time", "The Fight Club", "True Blood", "Alias", "The Agency, and "Prison Break". Azam has also collaborated with numerous musicians such as Serj Tankian of System of a Down, Peter Murphy of Bauhaus, Dredg, Chris Vrenna formerly of Nine Inch Nails, Kodo, Zakir Hussain, and Mickey Hart.



AUREEN B. ALMARIO (Ensemble) is an actor,

performance artist and educator. She is a resident artist at Bindlestiff Studio in San Francisco, CA and the co-founder of all female sketch

group Granny Cart Gangstas. She is currently the lead in Chasing Papeles, written by her sister Andrea Almario, a play which explores the undocumented experiences of Filipina caregivers.



YA WEN (WINNIE) CHIEN

(Ensemble) was born in Taiwan and currently lives and works in San Francisco. She studied MA digital Media in University of the West of England, Bristol. Her practice and teaching
