# The Wallis and Writers Bloc Present Senator Barbara Boxer with Paula Poundstone

(Beverly Hills, CA May 2, 2016) Continuing its partnership with Writers Bloc, the Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts presents the next installment of its highly-popular **Arts & Ideas** series with a conversation featuring trailblazing **U.S. Senator Barbara Boxer** with comedienne **Paula Poundstone**. The conversation will take place on the stage of the Bram Goldsmith Theater on Sunday, June 12 at 4:00pm. Tickets are currently on sale.

Since 1992, Barbara Boxer has stood for progressive politics in the U.S. Senate. She has been a steadfast advocate for women's rights, environmental protection and healthcare. In *The Art of Tough: Fearlessly Facing Politics and Life*, her new memoir about her decades in politics representing California's interests in the House of Representatives and in the Senate, Senator Boxer unveils her weaknesses and reminds us of her great strength as a pioneer in Washington. She takes us back to her involvement in significant political struggles, from the Clarence Thomas hearings to Iraq, with environmental challenges such as climate change. Sometimes she's won, and often she has lost. But she proves that by speaking up and speaking out, doing the right thing matters.

The Senate is indeed a perplexing place, and although it has its shining moments, it is not really what we would call hilarious. But Paula Poundstone is. Comedy Central ranks her as one of the best American comedians of all time and she is a member of the Comedy Hall of Fame. She was the first woman to host the Washington Press Club dinner and is the spokesperson for the esteemed American Library Association. She has had comedy specials on HBO and Bravo, and has appeared regularly on late night television. You can catch her comedy acts all over the country and hear her on NPR's "Wait, Wait...Don't Tell Me."

"The Wallis' Arts & Ideas series serves as a great public forum for the community to come together and hear new ideas or get compelling insight into public figures," said Paul Crewes, The Wallis' new Artistic Director. "Welcoming our own U.S. Senator Barbara Boxer in discussion with the astute Paula Poundstone, is very timely and will continue the political discussion sparked by Anthony Giardina's remarkably relevant drama The City of Conversation, debuting at The Wallis in May."
