DISPOSABLE

An original theater piece created and presented by The Wallis Youth Theater Company

January 25 – 28, 2018

(Beverly Hills, CA January 19) On a stage littered with the trash of contemporary life, *Disposable*, an original theater piece, confronts the relationship between human displacement and the disposable culture of the 21st century. Produced by GRoW @ The Wallis and created and performed by The Wallis Youth Theater Company, now in its second year, *Disposable* draws upon the company members' own experiences of displacement—some as immigrants, others as members of marginalized groups in society. Performed in English, Romanian, Farsi and Spanish, *Disposable* is a visceral, highly physical and sometimes witty piece that surfaces ultimately as a call-to-action for the planet and for finding a way back to our collective humanity. There will be four performances from January 25 – 28 in the Lovelace Studio Theater at The Wallis.

"We are honored to provide an artistic home for our young actors to hone their craft and use theater as a medium for positive social change," said Mark Slavkin, the institution's Director of Education who oversees GRoW @ The Wallis. "In a short time, Director Madeleine Dahm has already accomplished so much with The Wallis Youth Theater Company and we are proud of this very important and timely work."

"As this work is also a call-to-action, leading up to the show and for the rest of the Company's season, The Wallis Youth Theater Company will be highlighting the work of various environmental and human rights organizations that support new ways of interacting with natural world and the rights of the displaced, refugees and immigrants," said Dahm. "Through the Company's work, we hope that people will become more informed about these issues and encouraged to get directly involved."

The Wallis Youth Theater Company is a dynamic, groundbreaking company for actors in their early careers who are committed to creating world-class theater for social change. Under the directorship of Madeleine Dahm and produced by Grow@ The Wallis, the ensemble's crosses boundaries, and with an ethos of collaboration, creates thoughtful and provocative work that is rooted in examining our humanity.

In the its inaugural 2016/17 season, the Company mounted two full-scale theatrical productions at The Wallis, performed at Rise UP LA, and in Italy at The Crisis Arts Festival. *Thebes* by British playwright Gareth Jandrell saw its U.S. premiere on the Bram Goldsmith Stage, and in the Lovelace Studio Theater, the company presented *Word of Mouth*, an original devised physical theater play. *Word of Mouth*, featured on KPCC by Reporter Priska Neely, was an uncompromising look at Post-Truth and was born out of the rhetoric of the 2016 election campaign. In June 2017, the Company was invited to take the work to Arezzo, Italy.
