185 Wilshire: A Love Story

An original musical about the intersection of love, trust, and disability featuring a talented cast of performers with and without disabilities.

(Beverly Hills, CA, April 9) Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts and The Miracle Project present 185 Wilshire: A Love Story —an original musical following the lives of young adults with disabilities as they navigate finding and falling in love, learning to trust, and establishing independence. Created with a cast of teens and adults with and without autism, this musical tells the universal story about how a journey to find companionship often leads us to find our true selves. 185 Wilshire: A Love Story will be performed May 31 – June 3 in The Wallis' Lovelace Studio Theater, including a sensory-friendly performance for the Sunday matinee on June 3. The May 31st performance opens the engagement with a special gala event with proceeds benefitting The Miracle Project.

"We are very proud to join with The Miracle Project to develop and present this important original production," said Mark Slavkin, The Wallis' Director of Education. "In showcasing the talents and stories of these wonderful artists, we hope to inspire our audiences to appreciate the gifts and talents everyone brings to the table."

185 Wilshire: A Love Story emerged from conversations and an exploration of the hopes, dreams and desires of current students of The Miracle Project. For many individuals on the autism spectrum, dating can be a difficult and complex concept as it is inherently linked to reading social cues, understanding another person's perspective and making small talk. 185 Wilshire boldly confronts traditional stereotypes of people on the spectrum aiming to illuminate the very universal and yet unique challenges that those with disabilities face as they search for love, learn to trust, and establish independence.

The Miracle Project, founded in 2004, is a fully inclusive theatre, film, and expressive arts program for children, teens, and adults with autism and all abilities. Using groundbreaking and evidence-based methods developed by award-winning founder Elaine Hall, The Miracle Project focuses on the strengths and abilities inherent in its participants, providing tools to build communication, social skills, job skills, and friendships while developing a unique neurodiverse community. Through shared experiences with peers, individuals with autism and other disabilities find their voice, develop their talents, and rehearse for life. Participants once too frightened to even walk into a room of their peers, have now performed live in front of standing room only audiences at places such as Carnegie Hall, The White House, Lincoln Center, and The United Nations. Miracle Project participants have also been featured on the hit TV shows Parenthood, Speechless, The Good Doctor, Atypical and in the film Please Stand By. The Miracle Project staff offers trainings, summer camps, and professional development workshops nationally and internationally and at universities across the globe. Profiled in the two time Emmy Award-winning HBO film, "Autism: The Musical" The Miracle Project is lauded for changing the way audiences perceive autism.

Since opening its doors in October 2013, The Wallis has produced or presented more than 250 dance, theatre, opera, classical music and family programs to an ever-expanding audience. Located in the heart of Beverly Hills, California, The Wallis brings audiences world-class theater, dance and music, performed by many of the world's most talented and sought-after artists. Featuring eclectic programming that mirrors the diverse landscape of Los Angeles and its notability as the entertainment capital of the world, The Wallis offers original and revered works from across the U.S. and around the globe. Together, these structures embrace the city's history and its future, creating a performing arts destination for L.A.-area visitors and residents alike.
