# WALLIS ANNENBERG CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS PRESENTS SANTA CECILIA ORCHESTRA

in a Program of Music from the Americas Conducted by Sonia Marie De Léon de Vega

Concert, Part of Orchestra's 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Season, Features Dvořák's *New World Symphony* and Works by Copland, Piazzolla, and Arturo Márquez

(Beverly Hills, CA, January 24, 2023) – Santa Cecilia Orchestra, hailed for its sizzling performances, presents a range of masterworks from the Americas at the Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts, on Saturday, February 25, 2023, 7:30 pm, at the Bram Goldsmith Theater. Led by founder Sonia Marie De Léon de Vega, who "conducts with sweep and energy" (*Los Angeles Times*), the 60-member orchestra, currently celebrating its 30<sup>th</sup> Season, opens the program with variations on a "Shaker Melody" from *Appalachian Spring*, and selections from his distinctive American "cowboy" ballet *Rodeo*. Also featured are Ginastera's lyrical "Danza del Trigo" from *Estancia*; Piazzolla's *Libertango*, a hard-driving tour de force in the Argentine composer's unique *nuevo tango* style, and Arturo Márquez's Danzon No. 2, considered among the most popular and important pieces of contemporary Mexican orchestral music. The concert concludes with Dvořák's beloved American touchstone, Symphony No. 9 in E minor, popularly known as the *New World Symphony*, composed during the Czech composer's travels in the U.S. and inspired by American spirituals and Native American melodies.

Los Angeles-based Santa Cecilia Orchestra, named after the patron saint of music, is noted, in particular, for sharing the beauty and inspiration of classical music with Southern California audiences, giving special focus to Latino communities that are underserved and underrepresented by the arts. The Orchestra made its debut three decades ago on a summer concert series at Greystone Mansion in Beverly Hills.

Tickets for Santa Cecilia Orchestra (\$29 - \$79) are on sale now. The Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts is located at 9390 N. Santa Monica Blvd, Beverly Hills. To purchase single

Over the last three decades, Santa Cecilia Orchestra has grown to become a cultural force in Los Angeles. This year, the orchestra is celebrating its 30th anniversary. Its great accomplishment is not only to make magnificent music but to also make that music accessible to nontraditional audiences. The orchestra's educational program, Discovering Music, has reached more than 300,000 students in over 80 schools in Los Angeles communities. Santa Cecilia Orchestra's commitment to a mission that combines music and access has created a leadership role in the cultural life of Los Angeles. Sonia Marie De León de Vega was born in San Antonio, Texas to actress/producer Sonia De León and singer/guitarist Reynaldo Sanchez. At the age of four De León de Vega moved to Los Angeles, California, where she was raised and began her musical training, becoming an accomplished pianist and organist. While always distinguishing herself academically, her graduate studies led her to love and specialize in conducting, studying with Dr. David Buck. She also trained at the Herbert Blomstedt International Institute for Instrumental Conductors and at various American Symphony Orchestra League workshops with Otto Werner Mueller, Maurice Abravanel, Pierre Boulez, Andre Previn, Zubin Mehta, and Riccardo Muti. Her musical talents have inspired a large following in Southern California through live orchestral presentations, as well as an international audience through televised performances in the United States, Latin America, and Europe. She was the first woman in history to receive a Vatican invitation to conduct a symphony orchestra at a Papal Mass. *Hispanic Business Magazine* voted her one of the 100 most influential Hispanics in the United States in 2001 and 2005, and also named her to its 2005 "80 Elite Women" list. Univision, Mervyns of California and Target named her Outstanding Latina of the Year in 2000, and in 2005 she was named "Business Woman of the Year in Arts and Entertainment" by Senator Jack Scott and Assemblywoman Carol Liu. In 2006, she received KCET's "Local Hero" award.
