(Beverly Hills, CA September 17) The Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts (The Wallis), building on its reputation as a prime West Coast home for dance, presents a wide range of innovative dance programs during its 2018/19 season, featuring the return of Jacob Jonas The Company as the 2018/19 Company-in-Residence and the addition to its illustrious roster of The Alonzo King LINES Ballet, Cuba's Malpaso Dance Company, Los Angeles' Ate9 Dance Company and Hubbard Street Chicago & Third Coast Percussion. Lauded since its 2013 opening for presenting the world's preeminent dance companies and choreographers as well championing exceptional rising artists, The Wallis has previously showcased Martha Graham Dance Company, Matthew Bourne's Early Adventures, Twyla Tharp's 50th Anniversary Tour, Paul Taylor Dance Company, Limón Dance Company, South Africa's Dada Masilo, BODYTRAFFIC and L.A. Dance Project, among other esteemed artists.

Jacob Jonas The Company, acclaimed for mixing contemporary ballet, breakdance and acrobatic movement, is showcased in two engagements: an intimate studio series in the Lovelace Studio

Theater on October 24, 25, 26 and 27, 2018, and a world premiere in the Bram Goldsmith Theater on May 10 and 11, 2019. **Alonzo King LINES Ballet**, which creates works drawing on a diverse set of deeply rooted cultural traditions, appears for three performances on November 1, 2 and 3, 2018, at The Wallis' Bram Goldsmith Theatre.

The Wallis presents the highly anticipated world premiere collaboration between the acclaimed Chicago-based companies **Hubbard Street Dance Chicago**, a major force in contemporary dance, and the Grammy Award-winning Third Coast Percussion of a full-length work choreographed by Emma Portner and Movement Art Is, an organization that uses movement artistry to inspire change in the world, on January 10, 11 and 12, 2019.

After a sold-out run in The Wallis' 2016/2017 Season, Jacob Jonas The Company returns as the 2018/2019 Season Company-in-Residence with two engagements – first an intimate studio series in the Lovelace Studio Theater from October 24 – 27, 2018, and the other a world premiere in the Bram Goldsmith Theater from May 10 – 11, 2019. Alonzo King LINES Ballet, which creates works drawing on a diverse set of deeply rooted cultural traditions, imbuing classical ballet with new expressive potential, is featured in three performances Thursday, November 1 through Saturday, November 3, 2018, 7:30 pm, at The Wallis' Bram Goldsmith Theatre. Choreographer King, proclaimed "one of the few bona fide visionaries in the ballet world today" (*San Francisco Chronicle*), understands ballet as a science – founded on universal, geometric principles of energy and evolution – and continues to develop a new language of movement from its classical forms and techniques that connects audiences to a profound sense of shared humanity.

HUBBARD STREET DANCE CHICAGO & THIRD COAST PERCUSSION January 10 - 12, 2019, 7:30 pm - Bram Goldsmith Theater

The Wallis presents the highly anticipated world premiere of a new, full-length collaboration between the acclaimed Chicago-based companies Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, considered a major force in contemporary dance, and the Grammy Award-winning Third Coast Percussion with three performances on Thursday, January 10 through Sunday, January 12, 2019, at 7:30 pm. The new work features choreography by Emma Portner and Movement Art Is, an organization that uses movement artistry to inspire change in the world, and a powerful score by British singer/songwriter/composer Devonté Hynes, also known as Blood Orange. Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, hailed for its technical virtuosity and lush awe-inspiring performances is "a cure for the ills of the era" (*The New York Times*).

Located in the heart of Beverly Hills, California, The Wallis brings audiences world-class theater, dance and music, performed by many of the world's most talented and sought-after artists. Featuring eclectic programming that mirrors the diverse landscape of Los Angeles and its notability as the entertainment capital of the world, The Wallis offers original and revered works from across the U.S. and around the globe. The mission of The Wallis is to create, present and celebrate unique performing arts events and educational programs that reflect the rich cultural diversity of our community.
