Film @ The Wallis in Partnership with Film Independent Presents An Evening With ... Seth Meyers Moderated by Mike Schur

**Monday, April 17, 2023, 7:30 pm
in The Wallis' Bram Goldsmith Theater**

(Beverly Hills, CA, April 10, 2023) – Film @ The Wallis in association with Film Independent Presents “An Evening With ... Seth Meyers,” moderated by the TV multi-hyphenate Mike Schur (“The Office,” “Parks and Recreation,” “The Good Place,” “Master of None,” “Brooklyn Nine-Nine”), on Monday, April 17, 2023, 7:30 pm., in The Wallis' Bram Goldsmith Theater. Meyers is an Emmy Award-winning writer, *New York Times* bestselling author, and TV host. The program rewinds through Meyers' life and career, from his Emmy-nominated, 13-season run as cast member, head writer, and “Weekend Update” anchor on “Saturday Night Live” to his current gigs as host and writer of NBC's “Late Night with Seth Meyers” and his role as executive producer on a diverse slate of shows like Peacock's “The Amber Ruffin Show,” IFC's “Documentary Now!,” Hulu's “The Awesomes” (to which he also lent his voice), and NBC and Peacock's “A.P. Bio.” The evening will also include an audience Q&A with Meyers and Schur.

In 2022, “Late Night with Seth Meyers” was nominated for an Emmy Award for Outstanding Variety Talk Series. Meyers also received back-to-back Emmy nominations in 2021-22 for “Late Night's” digital series, “Corrections,” for Outstanding Short Form Comedy, Drama or Variety Series. Meyers hosted the Primetime Emmy Awards in 2014 and was Emmy nominated in 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 for Outstanding Writing for a Variety Series. In 2019, he released his debut standup special, *Lobby Baby*, on Netflix, which was Emmy nominated for Outstanding Writing for a Variety Special. In 2018, he hosted the Golden Globe Awards, which was Emmy nominated for Outstanding Variety Special. “Late Night” won back-to-back Critics' Choice Awards for Best Talk Show in 2020-21 and was nominated a third time in 2022. In addition, Meyers was named one of the 2014 TIME 100, Time magazine's 100 most influential people.

Meyers began his TV career with “Saturday Night Live” in 2001, where he was a cast member for 13 seasons. He served as head writer for nine seasons and “Weekend Update” anchor for eight. In 2011, Meyers won the Emmy for Outstanding Original Music and Lyrics for host Justin Timberlake's musical monologue. In all, Meyers has garnered 29 Emmy nominations for his work in television.

In addition to his onscreen acclaim, Meyers is a *New York Times* bestselling author with the publication of his first picture book, *I'm Not Scared, You're Scared*, released in March 2022. Meyers and "Late Night" showrunner Mike Shoemaker established their production company, Sethmaker Shoemeyers Productions, in 2017. Meyers hosted the 2010 and 2011 ESPY Awards on ESPN and headlined the 2011 White House Correspondents' Association dinner to rave reviews.

Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts is a dynamic cultural hub and community resource where local, national and international artists share their artistry with ever-expanding audiences. The campus, located in the heart of Beverly Hills, CA, is committed to robust and distinctive presentations and education programs curated with both creativity and social impact in mind. Distinguished by its eclectic programming that mirrors the diverse landscape of Los Angeles and its location in the entertainment capital of the world, The Wallis has produced and presented more than 350 theater, dance, music, film, cabaret, conversation, and family entertainment programs since its doors opened in October 2013. Hailed as "au courant" (*LaLa Magazine*), The Wallis was lauded by *Culture Vulture*, which proclaims, "If you love expecting the unexpected in the performing arts, you have to love The Wallis." Together, these elements embrace the city's history and its future, creating a performing arts destination for L.A.-area visitors and residents alike. The Wallis is led by Michael Nemeroff Chairman of The Wallis' Board of Directors, and Robert Van Leer, Executive Director and CEO.
